Commencing at the forks of the Uniontown and Harrisville roads; thence with the Harrisville road to the corner of Sec. 17; thence an Easterly direction on the lands of Joseph Iddings jr. as near the line of Samuel Clark as practicable; thence a North Easterly direction across the ravine at or near the present crossing; thence up the hill bearing West of Iddings Hay-shed; thence along the present traveled road passing West of Iddings' house and Granery; thence Easterly down the ravine on the north side as near as practicable to the lands of John Porterfield, at the N.W. corner of his old orchard field; thence along near his paling fence South of his house; thence past the old lime kiln, keeping on the north side of the Creek to the line of Dunham Berry; thence down as near the north side of the Creek as practicable, crossing said Creek at the lower end of Dunham Berry's field; thence down the present traveled road to the St. Clairsville and Cadiz macadamized road. 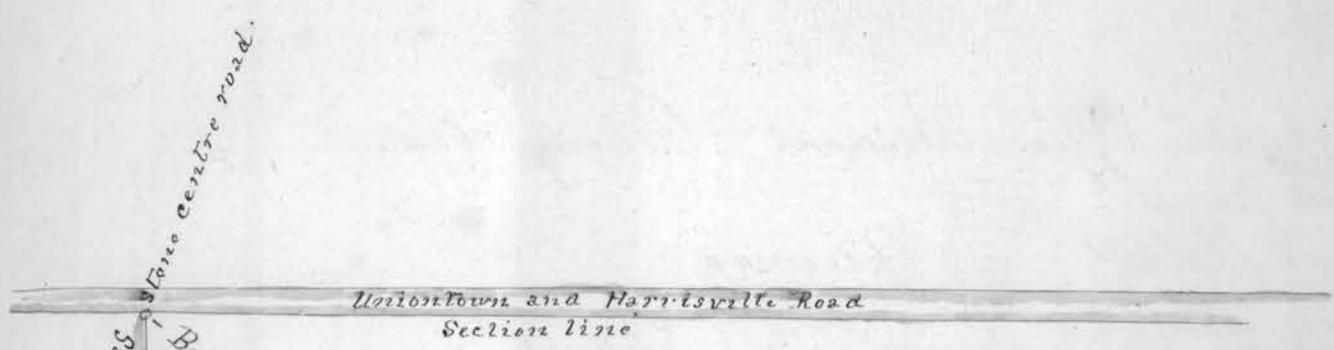

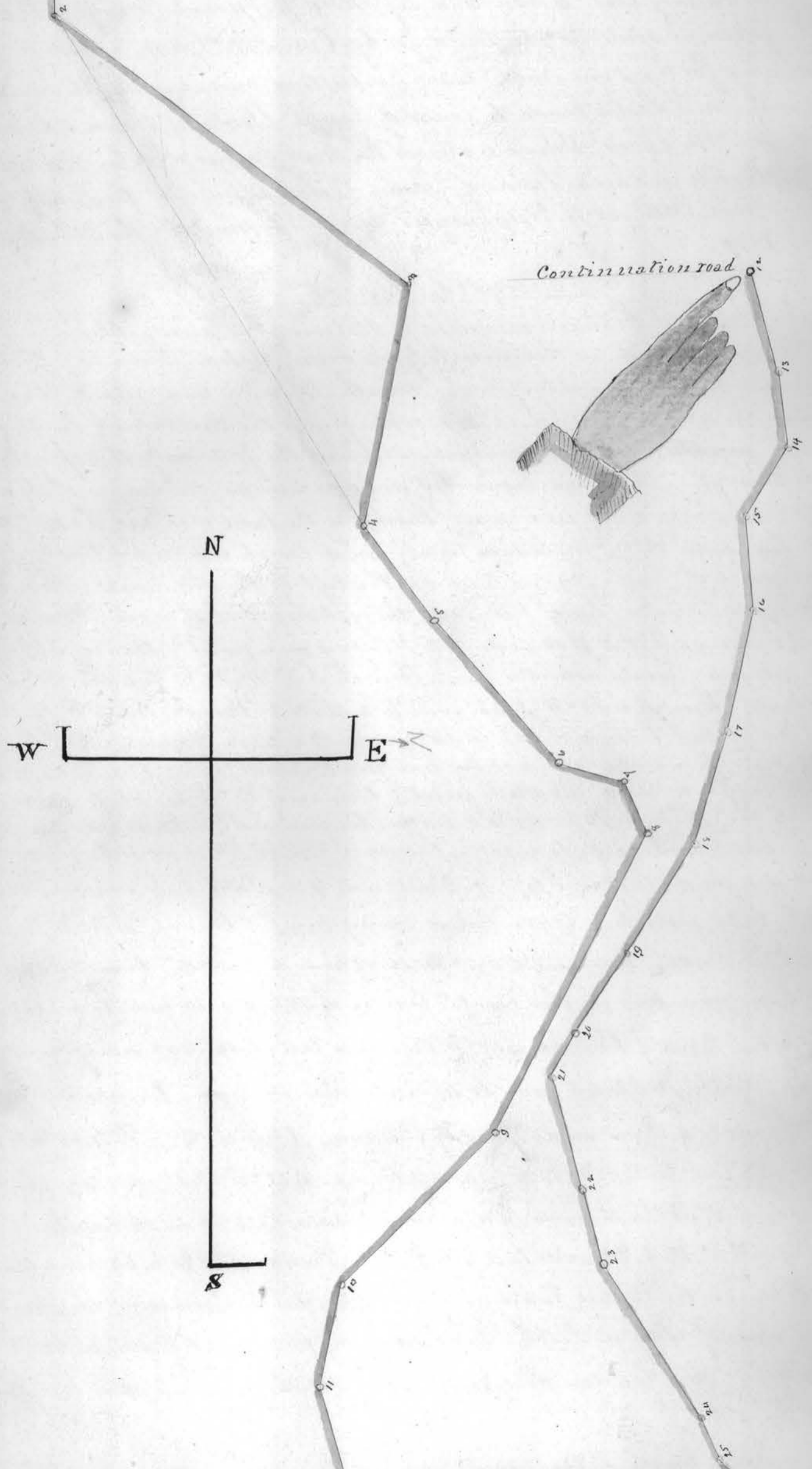

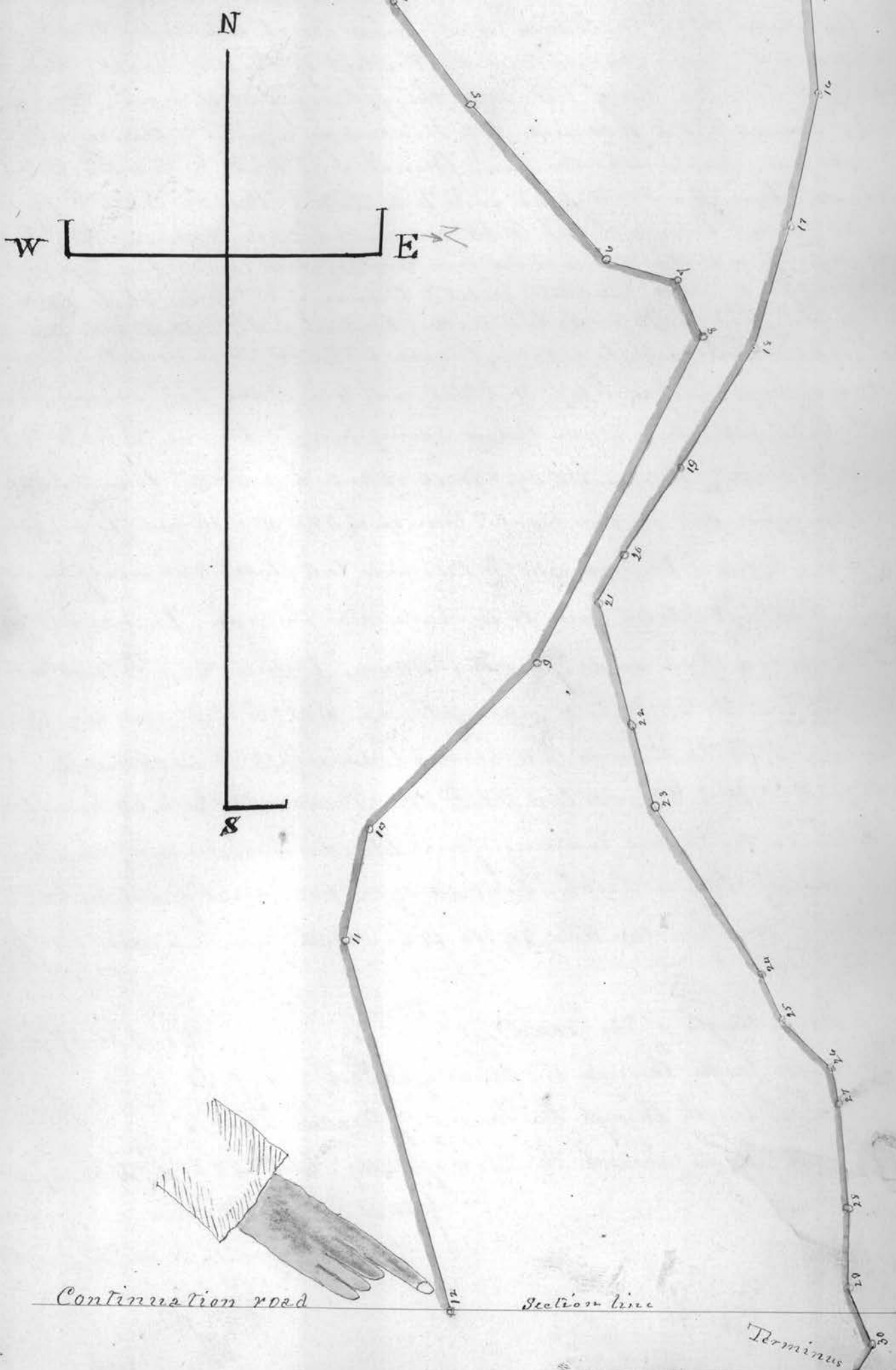
Uniontown and Harrisville road to Cadiz pike near St. Clairsville

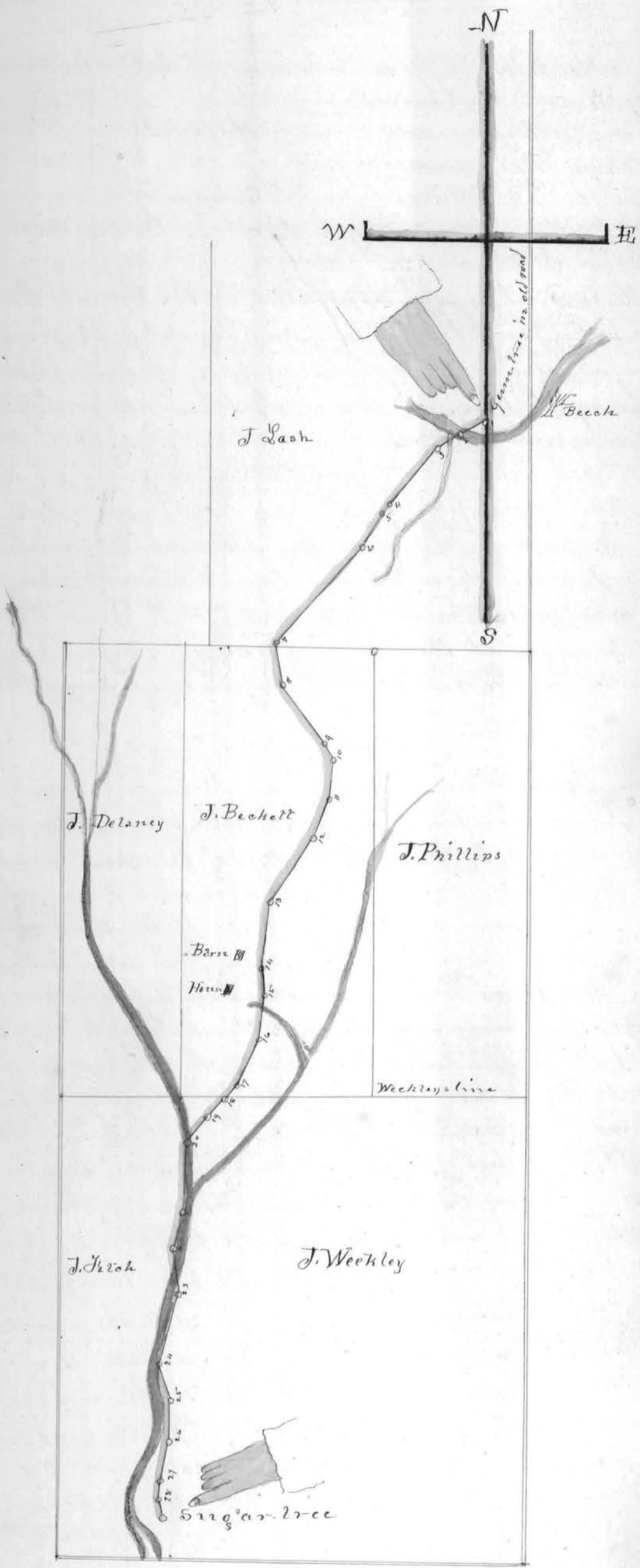

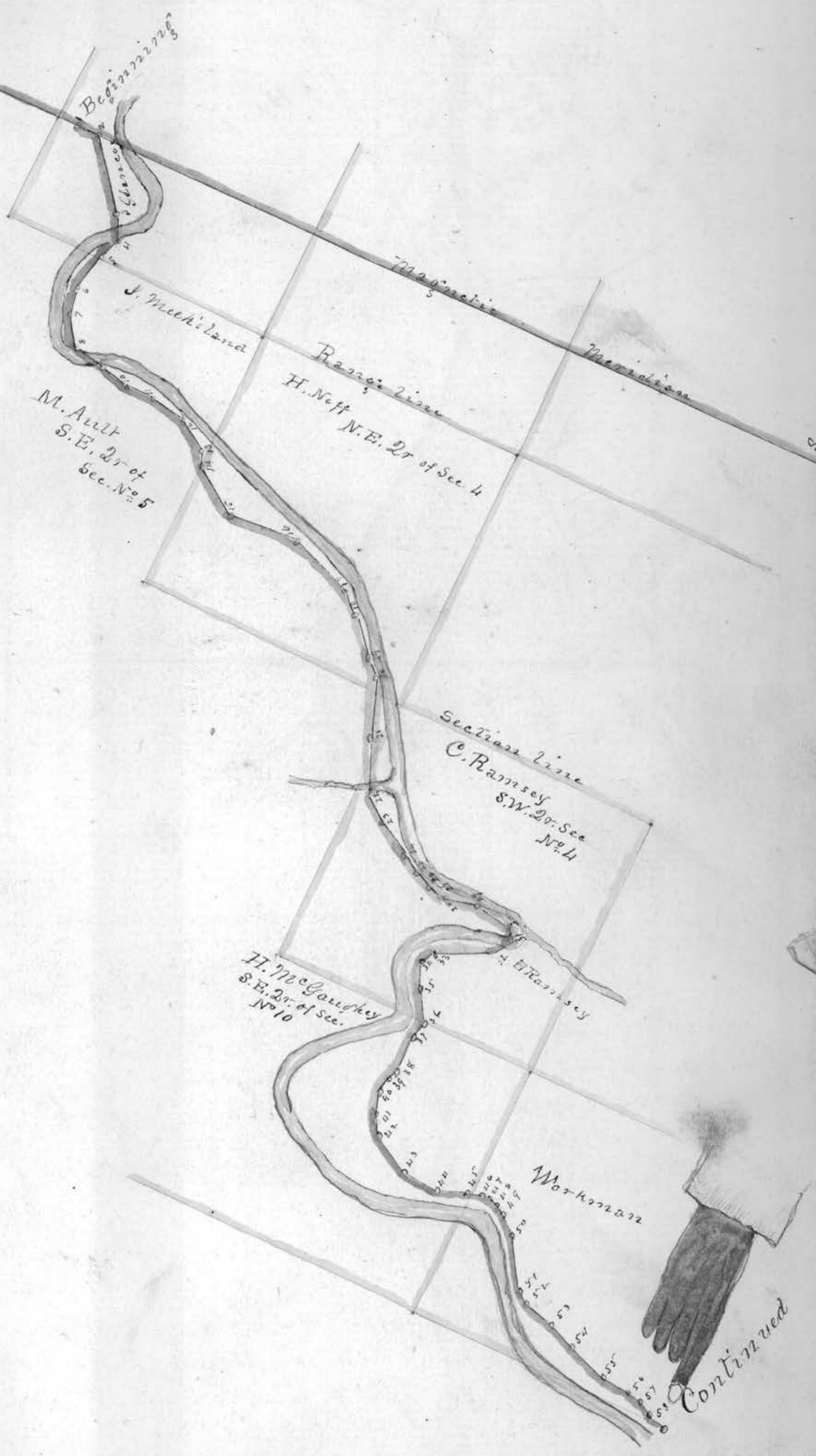
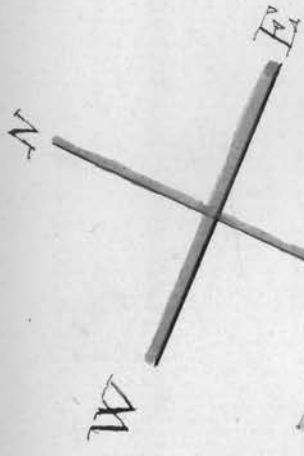
