

ROAD PETITION

For the vacation of a Road in Union Township,
Improvement No. 269 Petitioned for by Mike Tonovick and Others
TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the vacation of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning

At an iron pin in the center of where the Milner's Grove and Lafferty road intersects with road #62, in New Lafferty and thence N. E. a distance of three hundred and ten feet more or less to where the original Milner's Grove and Lafferty road intersected to the Mount Hope-Lafferty and Bannock Pike, and being that part of the Milner's Grove and Lafferty Road abandoned when Road #62 was established by the Board of County Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio. The abandoned part now to be vacated being the same as shown and designated on the "plat of change of Henderson Road" recorded as Road #62 on the road records of the county.
