

ROAD PETITION

For the vacation of a Road in Kirkwood Township,
 Improvement No. 443 Petitioned for by Harold Murphy and Others
TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the vacation of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning its intersection with the Murphy's Ridge Road in Section 6 of Kirkwood Township, Belmont County, Ohio at the residence of Harold Murphy; thence in a northerly direction through the lands owned by Harold Murphy, Hilda M. Triplett, and Clement Bethel to its intersection with the Six-Mile Run Road. This road is known as the Saw Mill Hill Road. We the undersigned petitioners ask that the above described road be vacated from its beginning at its intersection with the Murphy's Ridge Road at the home of Harold Murphy to the lane leading in to the home of Clement Bethel on the south side of Six Mile Run Creek.

3. Estimated compensation and damages, due each person, firm or corporation (with a * before the name of each minor or other person under disability), to-wit:

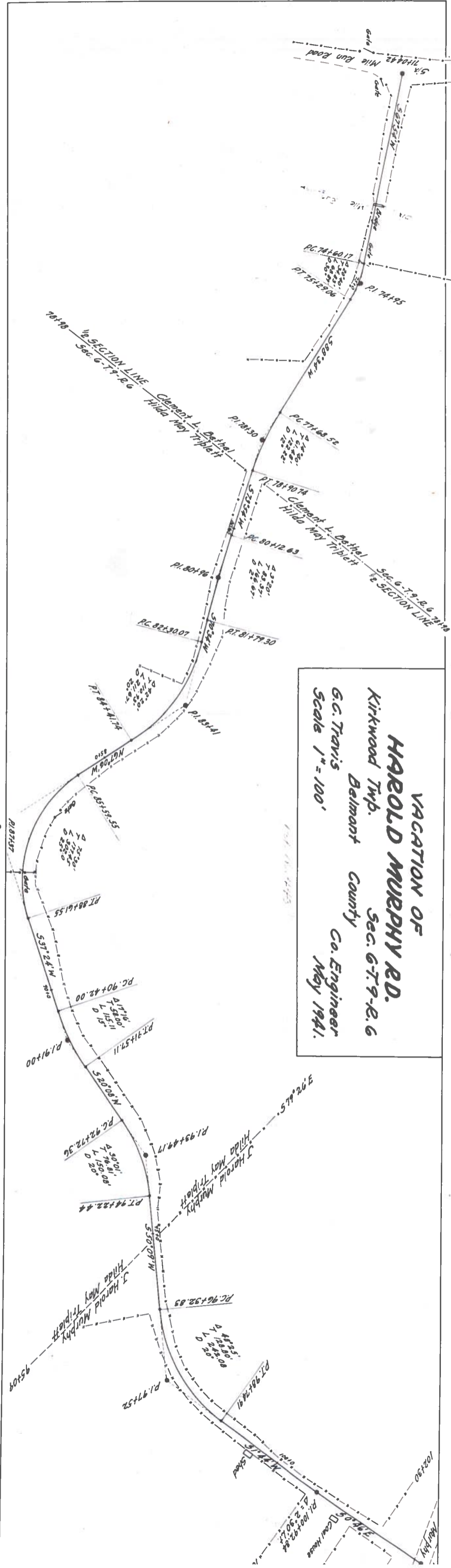
